

Emergency Financial Assistance Update: We remained busy throughout the year last year and were able to provide \$86,107 in financial assistance for rent and utilities. We were able to help 97 local households with rent to prevent eviction and had a total of 215 utility allocations for propane, gas and electric, totaling \$43,692. Christian Neighbors has strong partnerships with many local agencies, including Salvation Army, which provides additional housing assistance to our neighbors in need and the Catholic Charities Diocese of Kalamazoo, which runs the home heating assistance program January through March. We are so grateful to both of these agencies for their supplemental support. We are off and running already in 2025 and are looking forward to another successful year of helping our neighbors in need!

Celebrating Our Volunteers

Volunteer Spotlight: Kirk Holmes

Many people are surprised to learn that shuttling broken down cardboard boxes to a recycling center are an important part of the Christian Neighbors food pantry operations. But one volunteer knows better.

"Volunteers who unpack supplies to stock the pantry shelves generate a large quantity of cardboard that needs removed," says volunteer Kirk Holmes. So once or twice a week after his shift at Perrigo, Kirk opens a storage shed behind the food pantry building to find a big stack of collapsed cardboard boxes. He quickly loads the stack – which often reaches the ceiling – into his car then recycles the cardboard at the Otsego transfer station the next morning.

"Sometimes I can't even fit all the cardboard in my car," Kirk says. Why does Kirk faithfully complete what seems like a simple task? The answer stems, in part, from his childhood. "I remember a time when our family had no where to live," Kirk says. "We lived for a while in our car in a park and then ended up at the Salvation Army. Rows of green cots filled the room but knowing that I wasn't sleeping in a car was a step up. That time always stuck with me."

About 10 years ago, Kirk was living life when he felt called to do more and give back to the community. He responded to an ad seeking volunteers to help at Christian Neighbors and felt a special tug to help the organization tackle food insecurity needs.

"I know first-hand how life can throw a lot at you," Kirk says, "but being hungry on top of these things is horrible." Kirk applied to help with outdoor maintenance tasks but quickly learned that Christian Neighbors really needed help with the cardboard recycling.

"Now I do the task because I want to do it," Kirk says. "It makes a difference." The Alamo Township resident encourages people to explore what simple task they might do to help Christian Neighbors fulfill its mission.

"Bring your time and your talents," he said. "That is the best gift in the world since time is a finite resource that you can never get back."
